Restoration Technician

Position Summary

The **Restoration Technician** works with the A Rocha Canada (ARC) Conservation Science Team at the BC Environmental Centre to carry out seasonal restoration activities.

Location:	A Rocha BC Environmental Centre, Surrey, BC.
Start and End Date:	Between September 2026 to December 2026 with the possibility of extension
Hours/Days Worked:	Part-time (2-3 days/week, 16-24 hours/week, Tuesday to Saturday).
Wage:	\$18.35 per hour
Closing Date:	Until the position has been filled. Note: Anticipated 2 positions pending funding approval. These positions will be partially funded by the Eco Canada Jobs grant, and are contingent on funding approval.

Organisational Profile

A Rocha is an international environmental conservation organisation which, inspired by God's love, engages in scientific research, environmental education, community-based conservation projects and sustainable agriculture. We envision a hope-filled world where communities flourish as people and nature thrive together. A Rocha Canada's (ARC) BC Environmental Centre is a dynamic environmental centre with programs serving all ages and various ecosystems. The BC centre's 27-acre property is a living lab of forests, a threatened river system, a wetland, heritage houses, and a farm. This unique combination of sensitive wildlife habitat and agricultural land



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makes the centre a place where critical environmental issues are researched, addressed, and solved.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Assist with the implementation of restoration projects and activities, including those conducted on both the A Rocha BC Centre site and elsewhere within the Tatalu (Little Campbell River) Watershed.
 - Removing invasive vegetation
 - Plant native vegetation
 - Build beaver fencing
 - Construct wattle fencing
 - Install other erosion control techniques
- Help engage the public in activities related to restoration and conservation. This consists of restoration Saturday events and volunteer days.
- Meet weekly with the conservation science team for progress report meetings
- Help maintain good relationships with local conservation partners
- Awareness and adherence to A Rocha Health and Safety protocols

Working Conditions

- Work takes place primarily outdoors at sites around the Tatalu watershed (South Langley, South Surrey, White Rock, Semiahmoo First Nation Reserve). The **Restoration Technician** may be required to work in all weather conditions. Shared indoor office space is provided at the BC Environmental Centre.

Qualification

- A diploma, certificate, or training in environmental science, management, and/or restoration is an asset

Experience

- Experience in ecology or related fields, with preference given to those with applicable skills in forestry and freshwater systems
- Experience working collaboratively with volunteers, staff and diverse stakeholders
- Working knowledge and experience with tools involved in ecological research and restoration

Skills

- Standard first aid and CPR
- Must be physically fit
- Demonstrated ability to work quickly and efficiently outside in all weather

Critical Qualities



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- Embodies A Rocha Canada's commitments and core values
- Professional and gracious demeanor in written and oral communication
- Able to work both independently and within a team environment; able to resolve interpersonal conflicts professionally; excellent collaboration skills; positive attitude

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must:

- Be a student enrolled at a university or college in the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art or Math (STEAM) and Business
- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of employment;
- Have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada following relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations;
- And obtain a Criminal Record Background and Vulnerable Sector check.
